



IHA NATIONAL OFFICIATING MANAGER

IHA requires a highly skilled individual with proven management and organisational skills to fill the position of National Officiating Manager. The traditional role of the IHA RIC was split into 2 positions last year to better meet the objectives of IHA to grow this vital part of our sport and develop our officiating capabilities. Having filled the National Officiating Performance Manager role, IHA is again seeking an individual committed to supporting and administering IHA's direction and objectives for officiating.

The National Officiating Manager has the following responsibilities

1. Selects official's representation at IHA National Tournaments and National Leagues.
2. The approval of allocations of all AIHL regular season games.
3. Liaise with the National Officiating Performance Manager and the AIHL for AIHL Finals allocations.
4. Liaise with National Officiating Performance Manager and State RIC's for National Tournament allocations.
5. Manage and chair the operation of the IHA Officiating Council and its meetings as per IHA objectives and directive.

This individual must have the following

- Strong hockey background with a vision and/or demonstrated experience in effecting change to support the modern game of hockey
- Excellent management & organisational skills
- Financial portfolio management experience
- Ability to present to various size groups of stakeholders
- Ability to work with all stakeholders to uphold officiating standards that meet the requirements for IHA's National Tournaments and National Leagues
- Integrity

The key skills requirements do not necessarily require candidates to have an officiating background, a strong hockey background is essential. The National Officiating Manager reports directly to the IHA Board. This is a voluntary role, and it is expected that the individual is not actively officiating during their tenure.
