Environment	<p>Ice Hockey Australia (IHA) is the official national governing body of ice hockey in Australia and is a member of the international Ice Hockey Federation (IIHF). It was first established in 1908, making it one of the oldest national ice hockey associations in the world. The purpose of Ice Hockey Australia is to encourage, promote, control, and administer all forms of ice hockey in and throughout Australia in conjunction with our Member Associations (MA) for the mutual and collective benefit of all members and the sport itself.</p> <p>Vision: To become a fully national sport, with ice hockey leagues in all Australian States and Territories who participate in IHA national leagues and championships. For Australian teams to regularly medal at IIHF world championships, and an Australian team to compete at the 2030 Winter Olympics.</p> <p>Mission: Our mission is to promote and grow the sport of ice hockey at all levels throughout Australia, providing our social, junior, senior, and elite level members an opportunity to maximise their potential.</p> <p>Values: HEALTH & WELLBEING EXCELLENCE SAFE INTEGRITY INCLUSIVE</p>
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Primary Job Purpose	<p>The Head Coach is to ensure that their assigned team players are technically, tactically, physically, and mentally prepared for competition in World Championship standard events.</p> <p>The Head Coach will prepare the team optimally for competition at IIHF World Championships or International Tours; leading and delivering the coaching duties of the team according to best-practice high-performance standards and behaviours on and off the ice.</p>
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	<p>The Head Coach is a volunteer position reporting to the General Manager of Ice Hockey Australia, and will lead all matters related to the training, preparation, and competition of national team players.</p>
<p>Job Responsibilities</p>	<p>Pre-Championship:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Design, lead and implement a world class training program to prepare all team members and on-ice staff for optimal readiness for world championship standard events • Manage and lead a team of support staff consisting of, but not limited to, assistant coaches, strength and conditioning coaches, physiotherapists, psychologists, analysts, dieticians, and other performance staff • Lead a squad (long list) and team selection process set by IHA Board in accordance with IHA's strategic pillars • Initiate and maintain contact with all selected players to review and track training progress • Actively plan and participate in training camps and preparation activities • Be familiar with the Player Agreement and the roles and responsibilities of the Chef de Mission, Team Manager and team staff • Support the design of strength and conditioning programs, and use of technology, for player analysis and performance • With the support of the coaching team conduct player assessments to assist with player specific training programs and required resources • Work with the Chef de Mission, Team Manager, staff, and leaders to create and maintain a professional, inclusive, and safe culture with team-collaborated goals and standards • Communicate regularly with appropriate staff and team medical staff and immediately notify them of any inconsistencies or concerns related to players • Work with the Team Manager to prepare a Championship schedule/program that enables high-performance while on tour, with special consideration for load (ice time vs rest) and nutrition requirements (pre and post trainings and games). This schedule to be signed off by the IHA GM or Board. <p>During Championship:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Execute, where required, IHA policies and procedures such as, but not limited to, alcohol, drugs, bullying, hazing and harassment • Support the Team Manager and Chef de Mission in their roles as the leads for the team • Assist team staff in maintaining the safety and security of Ice Hockey Australia players • Ensure all player injuries, whether during practice or games, are immediately reported to the team physiotherapist/doctor for appropriate management of injury • In co-operation with the coaching team, develop a game plan for each game during the IIHF World Championships • Travel to and from the IIHF World Championships as part of the Australian National Team • Lodge with the team delegation for the entire duration of the IIHF World Championships.
